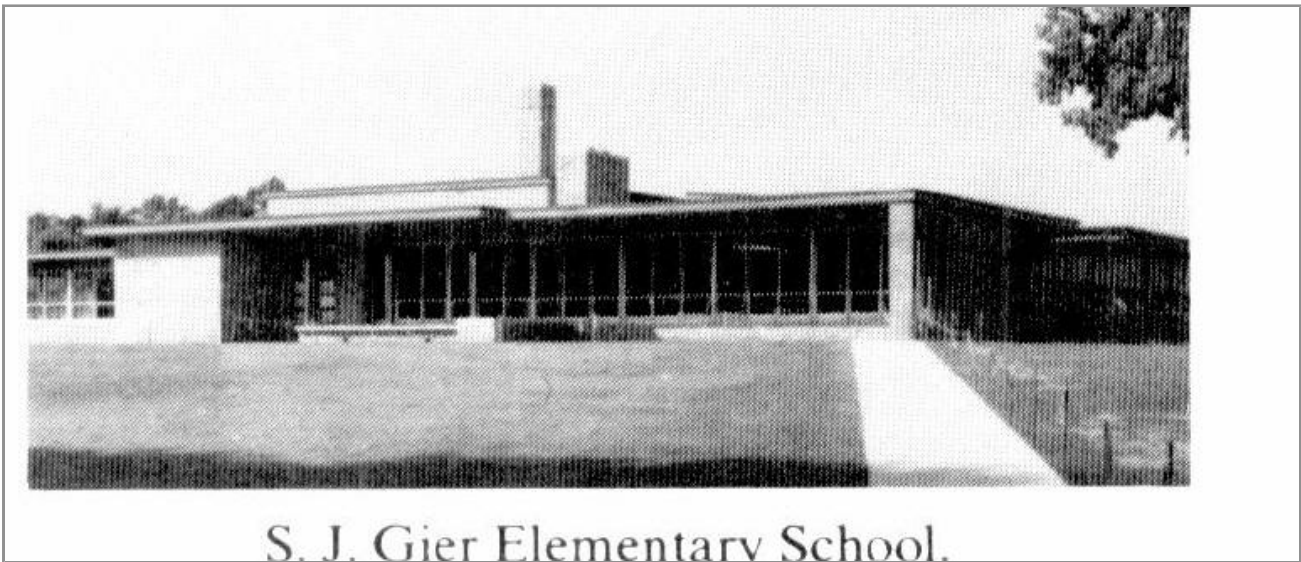

Bailey Class History

In 1949 the Bailey Class of "56" started Kindergarten. As of this moment there are 67 in the entire grade class, but only 40 of us started Kindergarten here with Mrs. Holiday and Mrs. Whiting.

We had Many unusual experiences such as falling in the pond. Breaking dolls. Falling off the merry-go-round, slipping out of the swings and ending up with lumps on our heads. Sometimes we would build playhouses out of blocks. We learned how to print our numbers and ABC's.

We finished Kindergarten and continued on to first grade, where we had as teachers, Mrs. Dagon, Mrs. Davis and Miss Walpole. We had some new friends and got along well with everyone. We had some new experiences such as hiding from teachers, who of course didn't like it. Once in a while we got hold of some ink and spilled it all over our friends, and had to sit in the corner for being bad. Some of the things we did in first grade were visiting the fire station and Jimmy Nichols Turkey Farm. We also studied phonics, but didn't like it too well.

As the class of 56 moved on to second grade, we met Mrs. Teal, Mrs. Gettings and Mrs. Gard. The girls in the class began their bluebird years. We had picnics and one of them was held in Mrs. Gettings yard. We had some of the usual troubles such as fighting and getting hurt. We learned how to spell but not to well. We made some art pictures for the fair with Mrs. Fields. We also had music with Miss Kamiensky. We had learned to write by the end of the year.

We continued on writing in the third grade, where we had as teachers Miss Cascarelli, Miss Sweeney and Miss Morlock. Mary Jo Roby won first prize and Julia Kriser won third prize for reading the most books, in Miss Sweeney's room. In Miss Morlock's room Mary Ann Hanson won first prize and Marilyn Bunce won third prize for reading the most books too. This too, was a good year.

We went to fourth grade where we had as teachers Miss Sweeney and Miss Sears. While we were in Miss Sweeney's room we went down to the library to look at some old newspapers. Some took books out to read. We had a schedule to follow such as, dusting, sweeping, and doing the boards. We also went on picnics from both rooms. We flew up from Bluebirds to Campfire this same year. In Miss Sears room we went down to the library every morning. We could go up to the room at noon to do art or some other work. This was the first year we were in the Spring Cantata.

In the sixth grade we continued orchestra and band. We met Mrs. McLean, Mr. Boyse and Mrs. Beddoes as our teachers. Mrs. Fields and Miss Kamiensky continued to help us with art and music.

Mr. Robert Lint and Mr. Jack Lint came to our building on Monday, Wednesday and Friday to help us with band and orchestra. Some of the things we did this year were, having patrol parties, Halloween parties, Christmas parties and Valentine parties. In gym classes we had Mr. Dunham for basketball and tumbling in the winter and volleyball and softball in the Spring. The boys had Mr. Boyse for basketball in the winter and softball in the Spring.

We have enjoyed very much telling you our class history, but now we are looking forward for the next six years, meeting new teachers and new experiences in Junior and Senior High School.

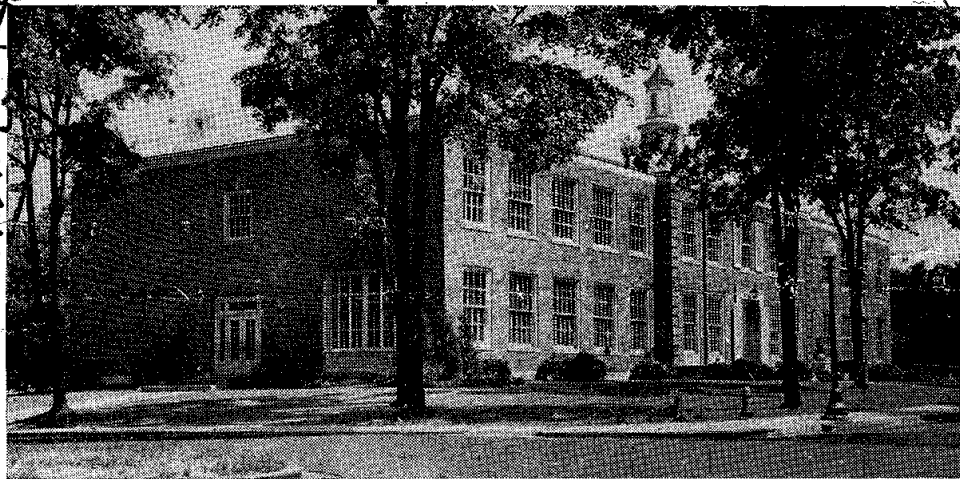
